#### TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This is to certify that the bearer **MR. RANDOLPH V. HAYNES** coached the above-named school football teams in the Secondary Schools' Football League (SSFL) for two (2) seasons, from May, 1992 to December, 1994.

He was responsible for all aspects of coaching both the Championship Team (Boys) twenty (20) students and the Senior Division Team (Boys) twenty (20) students. The students were of the same age group (under nineteen).

His assignment as coach required him to perform the following duties:-

- (i) Theory aspect of football programmes:
  - (a) History and development of the game.
  - (b) Rules of the game.
  - (c) Basic first aid techniques.
- (ii) Fitness:
  - (a) Fitness testing
  - (b) Speed, endurance, flexibility, agility, power and co-ordination.

Mr. Haynes had moderate success with both teams because of limited resources (finance). He showed responsibility and skill in his coaching job. Chaguanas ended both seasons in

third (3<sup>rd</sup>) position in the Championship Division which had a total of six teams and second and third respectively in both season in the Senior Division which comprised of nine teams.

Dear Gentlemen:

I am writing in support of Mr. Vernon Haynes' application to be a soccer coach for your establishment. I have known him for some thirty years. I was technical director of the St. Benedict's College Football Team from 1964 to 1968 when we won all the trophies open to our college. Vernon Haynes was an important member of that team. He played at many positions in defense and attack. He was skilful, and thoughtful. His technical skills were excellent. Our coaches at the time were a nationalized Brazilian, Americo Brunner, and a Dutch footballer from Surinam, August Wooter. As Mr. Brunner used to describe his ideal of a soccer player, football "es un arte", football is an art. I thought then in the late 1960s that Vernon would make an outstanding coach. I left Trinidad in 1968 to study for my doctorate and I have been a Professor at the City University of New York since 1971. I met Vernon again five years ago and have followed his progress as a coach. I feel certain that he will make a very fine coach. His technical excellence as a player, his quiet, thoughtful manner, make him the kind of coach that can inspire players.
